Day 1 | Arusha

There is a private bathroom with bath robes in each unit.

Meals are prepared by the professional chef and manager Axel Jansens at the on site restaurant, offering a mix of local and Belgian cuisine. **Machweo House** also offers special diet menus and packed lunches.


Guests can enjoy a massage or relax in the wellness centre, equipped with a sauna and hammam.

DAY 2 & 3

TARANGIRE NATIONAL PARK

From Arusha our guide will take you to Tarangire National Park where you'll spend a couple of nights at the amazing Oliver's Camp!

About Tarangire National Park

After the Serengeti, Tarangire has the greatest concentration of wildlife in Tanzania and in the dry season the Tarangire River is a magnet for thirsty wildlife.

Large herds of elephants and migratory wildebeest, zebra, buffalo, impala, gazelle, hartebeest and eland gather and not surprisingly the predators follow.

This is also the one place in Tanzania where drycountry antelope such as oryx and gerenuk are regularly spotted. Tarangire is also known for its spectacular baobab trees, and its breathtaking views of the Masaai Steppe and the mountains to the south.

ABOUT OLIVER'S CAMP & TARANGIRE NATIONAL PARK



Overnight: Oliver's Camp

Discover Africa, just as it should be. Oliver's Camp – in the remote southern reaches of Tarangire National Park – has just 10 beautifully appointed safari tents in a spectacular location close to the gamedense Silale Swamps and overlooking a flood plain of the Minyonyo Pools.



Oliver's was inspired by the trailblazing camps that pioneered the early days of safari. It gives you direct access to the dense concentration of wildlife you will find year-round in this remote region, as well as the chance to enjoy walking safaris and fly camping. Oliver's is intimate and personal, staffed by a world-class team that has worked together for many years to perfect a safari experience that guests consistently rank among their best.

Open vehicle Game Drives

With a reputation for fantastic guiding, Oliver's game drives take you to the heart of the action every time. Drives are offered twice daily in the cooler mornings and evenings. Most of our game drives make use of an open game-viewing vehicle – this lets you sit at different levels and gives everyone a 'window' seat. Our open vehicles have power points where you can recharge your devices, and are fitted with fridges to keep your drinks deliciously frosty.

We do have a closed game-viewing vehicle fitted with a cooler box for chilled drinks that may be used if available.









There is a good chance to spot some "Tree-hanging-Lions" inside Tarangire National Park.

Usually Lions spend most of their time on the ground, but here in this part of Tanzania you could find them hanging out in the trees.

DAY 4 & 5 | NGORONGORO CRATER & HIGHLANDS The Ngorongoro Crater has one of the densest wildlife populations in Africa! Some ±25,000 wild creatures live within the Ngorongoro Crater, making it one of the most concentrated repositories of wildlife in the world!

Today you head further north towards the Ngorongoro Crater!

After breakfast you will drive slowly through the Tarangire Nat. Park towards Lake Manyara, where we'll stop for a lunch-break and hopefully get a good view of the resident flamingos! From here you will drive on the rim of the Ngorongoro Crater, one of the most concentrated wildlife areas in the world!

The Ngorongoro Crater was once an enormous volcano, since its last eruption millions of year ago it is now the largest intact caldera (sunken ground) in the world.

Some maintain that before it erupted, it would have been higher than Mt Kilimanjaro. Today, 3 million years after having collapsed and eroded, it is an extensive highland area located inside a 600m deep crater and it forms one of the most beautiful wildlife havens on earth.

Endangered black rhino are protected within its rim, giant tusked elephants wander the forests, black-maned lions stalk the grasslands, and flamingoes crowd the soda lakes.

An estimated 25 000 large mammals are resident in this bowl of plenty, including a population of approximately 6000 wildebeest, 16 highly endangered black rhino and around **70 lions**. Cheetah move in and out of the Crater, while leopard can often be encountered in the Lerai Forest!


To explore this amazing part of Tanzania you'll drive all the way around the crater and stay at the stunning Highland Lodge at almost 3000m above sea-level!







DAY 4 & 5




The Highlands redefines the Ngorongoro experience. Set on the edge of the mountain forest hugging the **Olmoti volcano** to the north of Ngorongoro Crater, The Highlands strikes a perfect balance between a true wilderness experience and a high-style, contemporary escape.

Experience the highlands of the wild Ngorongoro Conservation Area surrounding camp, home to leopard, buffalo and elephant.

Follow ancient Maasai trails to the summit of the Olmoti crater and visit local communities to catch a glimpse into the traditional Maasai way of life that has defined this corner of East Africa for centuries.

The famous Ngorongoro Crater is easily accessible from camp, while the setting ensures maximum privacy, a rich adventure and a range of activities not possible elsewhere in Ngorongoro.



Fly Into the Serengeti

From the Ngorongoro Crater you'll be brought to the Manyara airstrip from where scheduled flights depart **into the Serengeti**.

Depending on the season, we will advise you to travel to the southern, central or northern **Serengeti.**

We even have **mobile camps** we can use so youget a good chance to see the **Great Migration** of wildebeest & zebra, one of the most amazing natural wonders of the world!

We suggest you spend at least 3 nights in the Serengeti, but longer is always possible!









DAY 6 TO 9 SERENGETI SAFARI OPTIONS:

Wildlife viewing and bird watching game drives within the Serengeti are offered twice per day. Experienced guides encourage guests to see and experience the Serengeti through their eyes, sharing a world of small and large wonders that only they truly know and understand.

Balloon safaris are a romantic and evocative way of experiencing the wilderness of East Africa, as you silently fly over the plains teeming with herds of wildlife in the early morning.

Typically, a balloon safari begins around 6 am and lasts for around 1-2 hours. Balloon safaris (additional cost) in the Serengeti take off from designated sites in the nearby Seronera area. The safari is followed by a champagne breakfast in the bush, a fitting end to a memorable flight in the wild.

Walking Safaris

Heighten your senses to the sights, sounds and smells of the bush on a walking safari. This is one of the most intimate ways to experience the bush, the pace is easy and the memories will stay with you forever.











DAY 6 TO 9 SERENGETI & GREAT MIGRATION

If you want to see the Great Migration there is always a very good chance you'll get to spot them in **Northern Serengeti** throughout most of the year (from May to November) other times of the year we suggest to use a combination of camps in central or souther Serengeti or one of our mobile camps!

To explore this part of the Serengeti we love to stay at Sayari!

Sayari Camp is renowned for extraordinary wildlife sightings and supreme comfort. Set on the unspoilt plains of the Northern Serengeti, close to the famous Lamai Wedge, Sayari gives you easy access to the Mara River and multiple river crossing points.

Sayari Camp offers some of the world's finest game viewing – and it does so in remarkable style. Relax in your extra-comfortable hillside suite after a day on safari, or take a dip in the glorious rim-flow swimming pool with dramatic views over the northern plains. This place is regularly voted one of the top safari escapes on the planet.













OR... CONTINUE TO ZANZIBAR

The Zanzibar Archipelago is **part of Tanzania**. From the Serengeti it is possible to fly back to Kilimanjaro Airport, where you continue home.

But we can also **fly you directly to Zanzibar**, no customs, no visa, you stay within Tanzania. So in only a couple of hours you could be relaxing on the beach.. you can imagine this is **a very popular combination!**
